





November's title: The Rosie Project




The Movie "Country" (and Readlyn)

"Country" is a 1984 American drama which follows the trials and tribulations of a rural family as they struggle to hold onto their farm during the trying economic times experienced by family farms in 1980s America. The film was written by William D. Wittliff, and stars real-life couple Jessica Lange and Sam Shepard. The film was directed by Richard Pearce and was shot on

location in Readlyn and Dunkerton, Iowa, and at Burbank's Walt Disney Studios.

Lange, who also co-produced the film, was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Actress and a Golden Globe for her

Then-U.S. President Ronald Reagen stated in his personal diary that this film "was a blatant propaganda message against our agri programs." Some members of the U.S.



Congress took the film so seriously that Jessica Lange was brought before a congressional panel to testify as an expert about living on family farms.

PLOT -- Gilbert "Gil" Ivy (Sam Shepard) and his wife, Jewell, (played by Jessica Lange) have worked Jewell's family farm for years, and her father, Otis (Wilford Brimley), does not want to see his farm lost to foreclosure. However, low crop prices, interest on FHA loans, pressure by the FHA to reduce both the loans and operating expenditures, and a tornado put pressure on the struggling family as they face hardship and the prospect of losing their home and livelihood.-- Wikipedia

Just A Suggestion...

The movie "Country" was released in 1984, 37 years ago. Many of the Readlyn area citizens who participated in its production are gone. Others of those who were involved in the film are in their 80s and 90s. The movie lay dormant for a long time. Time is slipping away. "Country," which had a great effect on Readlyn, should be reintroduced.

Many of the people in the area have not seen the movie "Country" and are not familiar with its effect on Readlyn. "Country" should be made available for showing to those ing and being rented and was destroyed in 1989 by burnwho have never seen the movie, as well as those who wish to relive the past.

I suggest that a large TV be installed in the Conference Room of the Readlyn Public Library. "Country," and other movies, could be shown periodically. Roy Roger and Tom Mix movies and other films from the Readlyn outdoor movie era would be of interest.

A group of volunteers familiar with 1984 Readlyn should carefully dissect all scenes in "Country" which relate to our area. They should study the film and document where the scene was located, its effect on the movie, and who, from the Readlyn and surrounding area, participated.

The Readlyn Historical Society should coordinate the formation of the volunteer group and also be responsible for the purchase of all necessary video equipment. An expert from Nashua estimated the cost for a 75-inch screen and other necessary equipment would be around \$1,500.

Not many towns have been involved in the production of a major Hollywood film. Readlyn had that unique experience. "Country" and the thrill of its filming should be preserved as an important part of Readlyn history

I saw "Country" shortly after it was released. Now, 35 years later, I do not remember the plot. I recall only that I recognized some of my friends in the movie. I would like to see it again.

READLYN -- The Town of Readlyn will become a familiar landmark to moviegoers throughout the country as part of the setting for "Country," a Walt Disney film now in production in the Readlyn and Dunkerton areas.

According to Readlyn mayor Keith Fettkether, contracts are now being signed to allow Walt Disney Productions to use Readlyn City Hall, a building owned by Robert Meyer, the Center Inn, the Readlyn Savings Bank, and Farmers Co-op as scenes for the movie.

Readlyn will represent the small town where the farm family in the movie does business. Fettketther said that after "some talking" the movie town will be called Readlyn. The script originally called for the town to be called Allison. Fettkether explained that production officials were not aware that an actual town named Allison was located in the Readlyn vicinity. The mayor convinced them in terms of local pride that it would be better to change the town to Readlyn. He said they will also simplify filming in town because signs on Main Street which

City Hall will be transformed into a Federal Land Bank Office for the movie. Fettkether said the film crew will build a new front for the building, erect a new flagpole, repaint the interior, hang new draperies and replace the city clerk's desk for the movie scene. The mayor said he understands the Center Inn will be the scene of a square dance in the film and that the Farmers Co-op building will be used as a feed store.

Most of the movie will be filmed at a farm located four miles south and ¾ mile east of Readlyn. Filming is scheduled to begin this week. Readlyn city clerk Sharon Davis said she was told that the Readlyn portion of the film will probably be shot in late-November.

Fettkether said news of a movie being filmed on Readlyn's Main Street spurred him into completing an improvement project on a storage building across from City Hall. He said the building used for pump service was in need of new siding for some time.

"With any luck that building will show up in the movie and look terrible," said the mayor. So he decided to install new siding and new lettering, just in case.



Why Readlyn?

The Disney company contacted Paul Brasch, Waterloo realtor, to locate a site for a film. They were seeking a farm with an unoccupied farmhouse that had only one single tree. Paul, being from Dunkerton, was familiar with the area. Kenny and Barb Fettkether owned a farm that fit the criteria. The farmhouse was leased for four months at \$5,000 per month.

Jim Fettkether, Kenny and Barb's son, worked on a carpenter crew adapting the house to the story. After the film was completed, the house was rented. The family decided that the house was beyond repair after the film-

Jim stated that the production company had employees whose job it was to locate extras. People were notified that extras were needed. Many local citizens volunteered. Jim thought that the pay the extras received was \$35 per day plus a meal.

I contacted several Readlyn citizens who were paid extras in the movie, "Country."

Paul and Marilee Tiedt

Paul and Marilee volunteered to appear in "Country." Paul was in two scenes. He was one of three Black Hawk County farmers to walk into the feed store. Marilee was at Paul's side in the auction scene at the farmhouse. Paul handed out the items to the successful bidders

The filming of the auction scene took several days. Paul said they had to wear the same clothes each day and park their cars in exactly the same place. Extras received the minimum wage for their role.

Marlys and Elmer Wittenburg

Marlys and Elmer were in several scenes filmed at different locations. Marlys remembers a scene at Mt. Hope Church south of Klinger. A boy acted up in church. They had to let him out of the pew in which they were sitting. Marlys also stated it was required that they wear the same clothes every day.

In September of 1984, the crew of the movie "Country" moved their equipment into Readlyn for the filming of the movie. There were large trucks and trailers parked on the street. They also had their own food truck.

When they came to the bank they started to work on the windows for better lighting. The crew was very friendly. They did their job while we continued with our work. When they started filming scenes it was exciting to see Sam Shepard, Levi Knebel, Jessica Lange and Wilford Brimley. There was a scene of us gals working in the bookkeeping room. It was a very exciting for all of us.

The movie "Country" came to Readlyn in 1984. The basement was rented by Disney to feed the cast and crew. The dance scenes in the movie were filmed in the Center Inn. Jessica Lange's favorite meal was a grilled cheese sandwich and French fries.

Bob's comment -- What an exciting experience for the citizens of Readlyn, Dunkerton and the surrounding area to observe "Country" being filmed. For those who appeared in the movie and later viewed "Country," it had to be a thrill to see themselves on the screen.





"NASP Archery"

Archery — it's a passion of mine and something I've done my entire life.

As far back as I have memory, I had a bow and arrow, whether it was a suction cup arrow bow at a very early age, to graduating to my first recurve, then compound, all the way up to the top-of-the-line modern technology PSE I'm blessed to use today, archery has always been in my life. There's just something about shooting a bow that makes me feel great and I couldn't picture life without the release of the arrow.

Most of my archery experience has been geared towards hunting and the occasional 3-D competition, and my parents and family have always been supportive in my passion. As I'm now on the backside of 40, and as the years go by, I want to share that passion with as many as I can so our youth can have that same feeling of a great shot or a tight group of arrows in the target.

In the late fall of 2020, my daughter, Delana, came home from school with a NASP archery sign-up sheet and wanted to give it a try. She had always shot with me and asked me if I would ask to help coach. This month, I'd like to introduce you to our Wapsie Valley Archery program.

First off I'll start with an overview of the program. "NASP, The National Archery in the Schools Program, is an inschool program aimed at improving educational performance among students in

grades 4th – 12th. And through it, students are learning focus, self-control, discipline, patience, and the life lessons required to be successful in the classroom and in life."

The overall NASP program began in Kentucky in 2002 with the training of 39 educators and 22 middle school pilot projects. Shortly afterwards, many state agencies joined the program and NASP was granted a 501c(3) non-profit education foundation status. As the program has progressed, in a single school year, more than 2.34 million students participate nationwide. Since its initial inception, 48 states, 9 provinces and 11 countries have participated in the program and it is continuing to grow.

The first teams in Iowa were 2007. Now, currently around 225-250 schools each year report the two-week in-school portion. In 2019-2020, 42,000 archers were reported to have at least one archery lesson. This comes from in the schools and outside the school.

Our Wapsie team is starting their tenth year as a program in 2022. Led by head coaches Angie and Jason Auel, the team has averaged over 90 archers each season since its inception.

As the season neared last year, we purchased Delana a bow and some arrows to get ready for the first practice. In the NASP program, the bows are all the same. They are single cam compound bows with no sights and the only adjustment on them is the draw weight. Draw length is determined by how far each archer draws back to their anchor point. I soon learned that, if a youth wants to participate, they can use a school bow if needed, so the cost can be very minimal to participate.

As Delana and I attended the first practice, we were both welcomed from the coaches and the archers. This would be Delana's 4th grade season and, while she had shot her whole life, these bows were a completely different animal from her compound with sights at home. She started off erratic, but started to figure out how to shoot better after awhile and welcomed the challenge to shoot instinctively.

I, on the other hand, started off my archery coaching nervous. I knew how to help the young archers, but, to be absolutely honest, I felt intimidated with the talent of most of the students shooting that had been in the program awhile.

I was instantly impressed with how the coaching staff had these archers shooting. I started to think, "What could I possibly

tell these kids to help them when they shoot so well?" As time went by, my intimidation went away as I got to know the kids and realized, no matter how well you shoot, it all goes back to the basics.

With the help of Jason and Angie, and other coaches like Chris and Kim Gray, Mike Tiedt, Kathie Kane, and Brian Miller, I soon felt like part of the family and coaching became a lot of fun. It's so exciting to help the kids work out a shooting problem or watch them achieve their goals at a tournament and they excitedly thank you for the help and support. Delana improved each week and soon was telling me all the time how archery is her favorite sport.

Tournaments are usually held on Saturdays with a flight time for each archer and they work each week to qualify for the state tournament in Des Moines as individuals and as teams. From state they can make it all the way to the National tournament.

Registration for Wapsie's program began in October with practices starting in November. Invitationals will begin (most likely) in January-February with state being in Des Moines March 5-6.

Before I sign off this month, I want to thank Angie and Jason Auel for allowing me the chance to coach, and share my archery passion with the students. Also thanks to the above named coaches as well for showing me the ropes. I'm very excited to get the 2022 season underway!
